It is heartwarming – using the movie It's A wonderful life to frame a conversation about how we live with money. It is thought provoking – encouraging us to look at money from a personal history perspective; appreciating the joy of our blessings and coming to terms with our guilt about how we spend our money. This book will frame our Stewardship campaign this fall:

Sunday October 20<sup>th</sup> **Looking Back** - Scripture: Matthew 22:15-22 Our relationship with money has a history as long as our lives but also as expansive as the family systems and culture of which we are a part. Creating spiritual practices for how we deal money invites us to look back, to see with new eyes how and when our values and fears were initiated.

Sunday October 27<sup>th</sup> **Looking In** - Scripture Matthew 6: 19-24 Our faith is not just an idea, but it gets lived out in our actions in the world. This week we integrate money and meaning by looking in at the courageous vision for our presence and impact in the world. This is the bedrock for how we "spend" our assets—time, energy, and money.

Sunday November 3<sup>rd</sup> **Looking Out** – Scripture: 1 Timothy 6:17-19 When our money practices—no matter how incremental or seemingly simple—are serving the vision, we live with a sense of wholeheartedness and wonder that energizes us, those around us, and the world. We "truly live."

Sunday November 10<sup>th</sup> – **Looking with Gratitude** - Scripture: Acts 4: 32-35 At the heart of our relationship to money is living and giving with gratitude–whether the assets we have to give are monetary, or our own capital of time and energy for the sake of the human family. As a result of aligning our money practices with the courageous vision we see for ourselves and our impact on the world, we end our series by looking for the hope that has been cultivated and the possibility that we will transform fear to gratitude in the act of sharing. This is Dedication Sunday we will make a pledge of time, talent and treasures during this Service of Worship.

#### Something for Everyone

One of UPC's strengths is its Church School for all ages. Each Sunday we have at least 75 scholars in attendance! Yet it seems we never talk about church school or the benefits of a small group study and the opportunity for friendships and faith to grow. There truly is something for everyone! So what about our church school?

Our **Nursery** provides care for the youngest of our children during worship and Church School. Interim Attendant Nancy Marquette is overseeing the nursery which is located on level 2. 203

The **Beginners** group, which includes 3, 4 and 5 year old children, experiences the most memorable Bible stories through play, storytelling, crafts and act play. Charlene Johnson is the lead teacher. 212

The **Amazement Park** serves grade school children (1st through 5th grade) and a broadly graded experiential study of scripture using a variety of ways. Each month the class dives into a study of scripture around specific texts. This year begins with the 10 best ways to live - The Ten Commandments. Wayne and Chris Chapman and Vickie Sarver are the lead teachers. 410 Through Fellowship Hall

In the fall **Middle School** youth will begin a new confirmation study from Theocademy, an independent PC(USA) curriculum developer. Bethany Smith is the class leader. LL11

**High School** and **Post High** will be exploring how to make the Bible relevant today. The class always includes lively discussion. Ron France is leading the class. LL18 Middle School and Senior High youth have combined for the summer for a study of dealing with fears using Adam Hamilton's book *Unafraid*. Ron France is the lead teacher.

The **Neighborly** Class is currently studying *Engage the Gospel*. They meet in the library and the class is led by Rick Earle. 202

**God Knows Who** is a class of younger adults who have an independent study on faith, family and everyday life. Rachel Marquette leads the class which meets on level 2. (Pass the library and turn left.) 210

The **Fellowship** Class is studying topics chosen and led by Jerry Koser. Currently the Phoenix Class is meeting with this group. Jerry Koser is the class teacher. The Parlor (level 2) is the meeting place for this class. (Straight past the library) 204

**Sojourners** will continue its study of The *Great Ends of the Church*. Marti Klaus leads the class which meets in room 304.

**Wanderers** are studying the Bible using the Uniform series. Members of the class take turns leading the lesson. The class meets in room 306.



#### <u>Diabetic Corner – October</u> <u>What Doctor should I use if I am a Diabetic (or even as a prediabetic)?</u>

<u>Family Physician</u> or <u>Endocrinologist</u> or a <u>Nurse Practitioner- Endocrinology</u> I went from 2011 to 2016 using my family doctor. And it was fine but during my online search

I became educated about how to use your doctors and what to look for from your doctor. I got bold and asked my family physician why he didn't treat me for prediabetes way back when it showed up and waited till I had the diabetic diagnosis. His answer was: you probably wouldn't listen to me. You know he is probably right! Afterall there was no diabetes in my family lineage.... And I erroneously believed this was a family disease passed on. But a light bulb went off in me about why would he say that to me; I continued on with him and when he moved away I switched to a new family doctor.

I also was becoming self- educated about medicines in my on- line searches, magazine readings (Diabetic Forecast and Diabetic Living). Remember I had gotten my sugar under control without the benefit of drugs. (And I was proud about that...too proud). But in my self-education I was learning about meds that "assist" your pancreas by reducing the amount of sugar your liver releases into the blood stream; and assist your body respond to insulin. Basically with a medication I could give my pancreas a break or a vacation from the hard work it was always doing.

So that brings me around to.... Which doctor do you use? I was getting irritated with my current physician because we never seemed to have <u>enough time to talk.</u> And I was unsure of his knowledge level about all of the newer drugs. So on my own I pursued going to a nurse practitioner of Endrocrinology. It turned out to be the right choice:

1) She has plenty of time to talk to patients; 2) has great understanding of the diabetes medicines; 3) easy to talk too; makes me feel good about my choices; 4) she keeps my family doctor up to date on my treatment & she works well with suggestions from the dietician.

If you think that your doctor could be doing more or should know more or you feel disregarded it is probably time to check out a new doctor.
